

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to create positive social change and improve the lives of individuals living in the community of Alexandra, and other communities in need. We strongly believe that the youth in our townships are essential drivers of positive change, economic growth, and social development, therefore value formulating sustainable and scalable solutions for their bteerment

How?

- We support their small businesses and ideas in any way we can. (BIZNIZ IN A BOX, Linda's Shoes, Freedom's soap etc)
- Opening a sustainable kitchen and garden to help make sure that they do not sleep on an empty stomach
- Help them find bursaries (both high school and tertiary), and we help them find employment
- Provide relief by providing food parcels and toiletries for them and their families





- Take 400 kids to GoldReef City for an outing
- Take 300 kids on a helicopter ride
- Give wheelchairs 30 to the disabled
- Give away 300 McDonald meals to vulnerable children
- Have annual easter egg drives, blanket drives, sanitary pad drives,
 Mandela Day Celebrations and Christmas parties
- Expand to other townships such as Soweto, Tembisa and Rosettenville with our meals on wheels now and again
- Assisted 5 SMME in Alex attain mobile food trailers through the BIZNIS IN A BOX initiative by Coca-Cola
- 30x10 meter greenhouse from Coca-Cola for our Vertical Farming Project
- Open a soup kitchen at 48 London road, Lombardy west, where we serve breakfast and lunch to over 700 school kids, unemployed and lower class earning people per day. It is situated right in the center of three of the poorest primary schools in Alexandra, as well as one of the most populated shack squatters in Alexandra.



STRATEGIES

We're young, innovative and believe that through our different career fields and assets, we can easily collaborate/partner with various corporates in making it easier for us to reach our goals of alleviating the overwhelming poverty in our country.

We've introduced a vertical/Aeroponic farming system at our greenhouse, to help sustain our soup kitchen. Our proposed solution aims to enhance the sustainability and efficiency of our operations while ensuring the provision of fresh and nutritious produce for the 700 individuals who rely on our services weekly. Not only that but we plan on producing more hydroponic pods, as well as vegetables to sell to cover the operational costs that come with our organization as a whole.

We have targeted local ECD'S and street vendors to help supply them with affordable produce with free delivery in the aim help them expand their operations to help increase revenue while reducing stress with logistics. We've spoken to 30 vendors thus far, and 95% of them were happy with the model.
